What is the Forum?

Forum = Forum for Exchange of Information on Enforcement

- Network of authorities responsible for enforcement of the REACH, CLP, PIC & POPs Regulations
- Key tasks identified in REACH \rightarrow
- Forum ≠ enforcement authority ≠ head of enforcement authorities
- Members: representatives of National Enforcement Authorities, some from Competent Authorities, many are inspectors
- **BPRS:** Alternative and independent composition of the Forum for BPR





How does the Forum work?

Work delivered via Projects

- Projects prepared through Working Groups
- Main vehicle for Forum and BPRS work
- Outputs: project manuals, reports, methodologies, prioritisation of projects, training materials, advices on enforceability of restrictions etc.
- WG composition: Forum members, national experts, ECHA staff, COM support occasionally.

Plenary meetings – decisions and direction


- 3 times a year
- One open session with Accredited Stakeholders Organisations yearly
- Take decisions, decide direction of work, delegate tasks to the WGs





Enforcement projects: what are they?

- Coordinated enforcement action among many countries
 - Same methodology
 - Same scope of checks
 - Same questionnaire to collect results of inspections
- REF/BEF project vs Pilot projects





Harmonisation: How is it done?

Ultimate goal: "Level playing field"

How is harmonisation done?

- Alignment of EU level enforcement priorities
- Enforcement projects...
- Training of inspectors
- Harmonised conclusions on "practical issues"
- Same processes interlinks
- Same cooperation methods customs, OSH
- Same IT tools...

- Substances in Articles pilot project





Background

Reasons for the project

- Growing online sales
- The available results of past e-commerce projects showed frequent non-compliance of chemicals sold online (83%)
- Global market where cooperation between enforcement authorities is essential



Timelines

Preparatory phase: 2019

Operational phase: 2020

Reporting phase: 2021

- 1 January 31 March report results
- 1 April 31 December elaborate report



Product Safety Pledge

- Five major online marketplaces have signed the **Product Safety Pledge**, a voluntary commitment for faster removal of dangerous products sold on their online marketplaces
 - Amazon
 - eBay
 - AliExpress
 - Rakuten
 - Cdiscount
- Includes 12 areas, for example cooperation with EU MS authorities regarding product safety issues and have single contact points for EU MS authorities
- The pledge will be evaluated
